### **Treatise on Style**

Studies of political communication and framing have, and continue to, focus almost entirely on what is said. Meanwhile, very little attention has been paid to how it is said. This dissertation examines how political identity is related to the style of politicians' language and why that matters. The first empirical chapter introduces part of speech tagging for the analysis of linguistic style, with an application to partisan noun use in presidential speeches and a new collection of U.S. Senate press releases. I discuss the decisions an analyst must make when studying linguistic style as manifest in grammar and demonstrate that context must be taken into account. In the second chapter I argue that grammar facilitates at least two types of stylistic framing and that, like content frames, the use of these frames differs by partisanship in a manner consistent with party principles. I show that Republican press releases are more likely to focus on the past and draw attention to individuals. Releases from Democratic senators, on the other hand, are more likely to discuss the future and focus on groups. Finally, in the third chapter, I conduct a survey experiment to assess how stylistic frames related to time (past vs. future) and subject-scope (individual vs. group) affect individuals' evaluations of a fictitious congressperson. Using a statement on a grant reauthorization law as the backdrop, I find that simple changes in verb tense and pronoun number can affect individuals' perceptions of the representative and that individuals' partisanship is an important moderator. Thus, this dissertation shows that political identity is associated with differences in how elites speak and that those differences matter when potential voters are evaluating candidates.

## Living in Style

Surprising juxtapositions like goats spread across pianos and fearful optical illusions like eyeballs being sliced characterized the surrealist movement in the arts in 1928 when Louis Aragon published *Traité du Style* in Paris. Aragon had become ever more contemptuous of vogues and pretensions. In the name of surrealism, he produced the first significant critique of it. Instead of merely upsetting old relationships and skewering sensibilities, *Traité du Style* was meant to shock with a capital S, and it did. Only now has it been completely translated into English. Although time has attenuated the scandalous nature of Aragon's language, his criticism has lost none of its edge in this translation by Alyson Waters. From the beginning, which describes a postcard showing a little boy on a potty as representative of French humor and the French spirit, to the end, an attack in scatological language on the French military establishment, Aragon zeros in on one target after another.

Nothing escapes his notice or venom—whether it is the masturbatory output of contemporary writers, the prostitution of culture, or the perversions of government. Still, *Treatise on Style* is more than a brilliant diatribe directed against what Aragon perceived as the moral, political, and intellectual failures of his time. He proposes surrealism, in art as in life, as a means to achieve a valid ethical and aesthetic "style." Surrealism, as Aragon defines it here, loses some of its mythical and mystical trappings; it becomes inspiration with rolled-up shirt-sleeves. He exercises this faculty in his own writing, which aims to shake readers out of their complacency by alternating the intensely lyrical with the borderline obscene and juxtaposing the language of the educated elite with that of the street. Whether denouncing religious fantacism or dispensing praise, Aragon remains true to his idea of the surrealist project: to reclassify certain values through the act of writing itself. *Treatise on Style* entertains as a portrait of a movement and of a personality who kept moving.

There are also biographies of owner John I. Taylor and American League founder Ban Johnson. The book also contains a detailed timeline of the full calendar year, with essays on the construction of brand-new Fenway Park and its first

renovation, as the team (which won the pennant by 14 games) prepared for Fenway's first World Series. The 1912 World Series remains one of the most exciting in baseball history, extending to eight games because of a 14-inning tie game in Game Two. In Game Eight the Giants scored a tie-breaking run to take a lead in the top of the 10th inning, only to see Boston come back with two in the bottom of the 10th to win at home. Other articles in the book detail intriguing topics including a fascinating spring training, during which Sox players joined the hunt for a murderer in Hot Springs, life in Boston in 1912, and how the newspapers and telegraph reported the games in the days before radio, television, or the internet. It may surprise some to learn of the thousands of people who crowded outside the downtown offices of newspapers so they could get batter-by-batter updates on the progress of the World Series games-in-progress. There are more than a dozen books celebrating the 100th anniversary of Fenway Park, but only this one is devoted to the 1912 season itself, providing the context for the then-new park which remains home to Boston baseball a century later.
